At FoodShare, we advocate for food justice by supporting community-based food initiatives and through ongoing advocacy and public education. Our vision is a Toronto where all people can feed themselves, their loved ones and their communities with dignity and joy.

Main Tasks:

Flemington Community Farm is a Community Engagement and Entrepreneurial Development (CEED) project transforming 1/2 acre of unused land within the Flemington Park hydro corridor into a nature-focused public space for local community members. This summer we will be establishing and growing the farm: seeding, weeding, harvesting, and selling at the farmers market, as well as participating in weekly workshops about food justice, farming, community gardening and anti-oppression

Duties include (but are not limited to):

- Full range of garden tasks/activities: including seeding, transplanting, mulching, weeding, watering, pruning, and harvesting.
- Community Engagement: including creating a welcoming environment for volunteers, mentoring gardening volunteers, interacting with the public, leading garden tours, potentially speaking at events/with the media about the garden.
- Peer Leadership: including leading/overseeing volunteers in various garden-related tasks, co-facilitating community-based workshops, imparting wisdom about the garden to volunteers whenever possible
- Work collaboratively with Farm Coordinator and other FHC staff to develop educational programming for communities members
- Support to run shifts at the farmer's market, which includes mentoring volunteers and supporting them in handling cash, merchandising produce and delivering friendly customer service

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- Participate in FoodShare staff and team meetings, all staff training, board staff retreat and reporting requirements such as timesheets and handle other duties as assigned

Required Qualifications, Knowledge and Experience

- Demonstrated ability to work within a diverse community (people of different ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds)

- Experience gardening, growing food or working with plants is an asset
- Experience working with children and youth
- Knowledge of food systems, including growing, cooking, and composting
- Effective communication and organizational skills
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Familiar with G-Suite (Google Drive, Sheets, Docs, Calendar, Gmail, etc.)
- Availability to work one evening per week preferred (until 7 pm)
- Valid G Driver's Licence an asset

Job Requirements:

- Lifting and moving up to 40 pounds
- Working outdoors and on your feet for long periods of time
- A Vulnerable Sector Police Check (FoodShare will cover this cost)

Salary: \$22.08/hour (for 37.5 hours per week)
